Infrastructure & Operations

The Crest Development - Woodside

The last reserve in The Crest development has been handed over to Council's Open Space Department for maintenance. The reserve features a small lake (seasonal) grass land and garden beds, the reserve was irrigated for establishment but the irrigation will now be removed as the landscape is established.





Heavy Patching of sealed roads

Heavy patching of sealed roads continues with the preparation for this year's re-seals almost complete.

- Stentiford Road, Forest Range










Heathfield High School

Heathfield High School on-street carpark, the badly broken up section adjoining Longwood Road was re-sealed with asphalt suited to the regular bus traffic.





Adelaide Hills Council and Department for Infrastructure and Transport Collaboration

Works on two more shared intersections was completed with the Yanagin Road and Greenhill Road intersection at Greenhill resealed and the Woods Hill Road and Lobethal Road intersection at Norton Summit completed as well.









Tier Road, Vickers to Kumnick Road Section

Council has been successful in receiving \$330,000 from the Special Local Roads Program (SLRP) funding for Tier Road, Vickers to Kumnick Road Section. This funding is a competitive process and Council's successful submission will allow for full reconstruction of this road section to support our road asset renewal program. The funding from the SLRP will provide 50% of the overall funding for this road section and adjustments to the renewal program will be brought to Council at Budget Review 1.

Footpath Renewals

Greenhill Road, Summertown - renewal of 24m of footpath in concrete to provide improved and safer access to the bus stop.











Onkaparinga Valley Road, Balhannah - renewal underway of 434m² of asphalt footpath between Oakbank Area School and Ilinga Avenue.





New Footpaths

Atkinson Road, Crafers - construction complete of 225m of new asphalt footpath providing better all-weather access to the busy bus stop from both directions.

Community Capacity

Library Services

The library held 9 programs over the school holidays with a total of 120 attendees over the two week period.

Gelliplate printing and Games Hour held at Stirling were the most well attended with 22 participants at each program.

Craft activities such as making kaleidoscopes and Chinese Fan Painting also proved popular.



Economic Development

Council hosted another successful Home Based Business event at the Uraidla Hotel on Thursday 20 October. Twenty businesses met over breakfast to network and collaborate. Around half of the participants attended for the first time.

This growing network of home based businesses has provided a great way for individual businesses to engage with each other but to also be made aware of upcoming opportunities. For example, several in the network recently attended a Small Business Roundtable conversation with Minister Michaels and contribute to the development of the Small Business Strategy.







Amy Gillett Bikeway

Council has received confirmation from the Federal Government that the funding commitment made by the previous government for the extension of the Amy Gillett Bikeway to Birdwood will be honoured. The State Government's Department for Infrastructure and Transport is presently working on the design and cost estimates for the project.
